About Lucknow

The name Lucknow is synonymous with beautiful buildings of "Lakhauri" bricks, auspicious pair of fishes, tiny and delicate toys and shining banks of river Gomti. As soon as this name is mentioned the fragrance of "itra" (Perfume) starts titillating your nose; the musical notes of "raga bhairavi" and the unforgettable sound of dancer's tinklets starts ringing in your ears; and the sweetness of "dussheri" mangoes, juicy muskmelons, malai (cream) and "gulab revdis" (sweet) descend in your mouth. The life, cuisine, language and dress of Lucknow have always maintained the unique feature of this lovely city.

Legend has it, that Laxmana, younger brother of Lord Rama, was so enthralled by this picturesque site on the banks of the river Gomti, that he decided to lay the foundation of a city there, which was called Laxmanpuri. Years of colloquial alterations changed Laxmanpuri to present day Lucknow.

During the reign of Nawab Wajid Ali Shah, Lucknow witnessed a resurgence of the Ganga/Jamuni culture of Awadh in all its dimensions from the classical traditions to folklore. Nawab Wajid Ali Shah's patronage gave kathak enormous scale and dimension. Kathak as a dance form found its spiritual place. Crafts of all kinds flourished in the city of Lucknow and its environs.

The vestiges of Nawabi era are sprinkled everywhere in Lucknow. The bazars (market places) of Lucknow once competed with those at Damascus and Egypt. All that glitter is still not lost. The crafty artisans still churn out "Chikan" and "Zari" clothes, Jamdani garments, "Meena" jewellery and the "Warakhs" (silver foils) which command the same respect as they did centuries ago. Today the chikan garments constitute an industry in their own rights.

"Hina", "Kevda", "ShamatulAmber" and "Shamime naaz" (all fragrances) are still popular in the world; "Sheermal", "Kulcha", "Nahri Dum Pukhta" and "Kababs" (all cuisine) still maintain the same taste and attract the Indian and foreigners alike. The old pastime of kite flying, cock fight, "Chaupar" an indoor game and Shatranj (Chess) is still practised and provides the same sense of adventure, peace and satisfaction as it did centuries ago. Although it is now a bustling metropolis yet the ambience persists. The tourists long to see the magnificent buildings and well laid out gardens. The sun still sets behind the imposing skyline of the Imambaras, ushering in daily the fabled "Shaame--Avadh" (The Evening of Avadh).

Dear friends and colleagues,

It gives us immense pleasure in inviting you for the CME on Septic shock and Fundamental Critical Care Support (FCCS) course being organized by the Department of Critical Care Medicine, SGPGIMS, Lucknow, U. P.

A large number of patients with severe sepsis develop hypotension despite adequate fluid resuscitation, along with the presence of perfusion abnormalities of various organs. The speed and appropriateness of therapy administered in the initial hours is most likely to influence the outcome in these patients of septic shock. The Department of Critical Care Medicine, SGPGI, Lucknow will be organizing a CME on Septic shock on 24th September 2010 to emphasize the management related issues on septic shock. This CME on septic shock is likely to be of interest to colleagues from critical care, internal medicine, pediatrics, pulmonary medicine, surgery and anesthesiology.

Following the CME will be a Society of Critical Care Medicine (SCCM) USA approved two-day course of FCCS which provides an exposure to the basic principles of critical care. Primary goal of FCCS is to enhance the ability of practitioners to perform the initial assessment, management, and stabilization of critically ill patients. This course is designed for primary care physicians, mid-level providers, general surgeons, and critical care trainees. Specific topics which will be covered under the FCCS include airway management, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, acute respiratory failure, mechanical ventilation, basic hemodynamic monitoring, shock, neurological emergencies, trauma, myocardial ischemia, life-threatening infection, and life threatening metabolic disturbances. There will be limited enrollment of 5 seats for instructors and 45 seats for providers. Please register early to secure your participation.

We look forward to welcoming you in September 2010.
