Dear friends,

It gives us pleasure to invite you for the CME on 'Critical care: Paediatric considerations' and workshop on blood gases organized by the department of Critical Care Medicine, SGPGIMS, Lucknow.

Children are unique in their critical care needs. While they are more vulnerable to decompensate following an illness, they respond rapidly to resuscitation and have good outcomes with intensive care. The spectrum of illnesses, their manifestations and the management strategies are different and hence it can be rightly said 'children are not small adults'. This CME would focus on the various common aspects of paediatric critical care including CPR, fluid therapy, neurocritical care, diabetic ketoacidosis, respiratory failure, weaning, nutrition and antibiotic use. Apart from being useful for paediatric trainees, especially those in paediatric critical care, it would also allay the fears of an adult intensivist who may be called upon to look after a child in the ICU. The faculty for the CME includes the best teachers in paediatric critical care from India and the father of paediatric critical care, Prof. Frank Shann from the PICU at the Royal Children's Hospital, Melbourne.

Following this will be a one day workshop on blood gas analysis. Appropriate interpretation of blood gases is a must for good quality intensive care. Didactic lectures on the different facets of blood gas will be followed by small group discussions dealing with case scenarios where different types of blood gas disturbances would be analysed based on the approach discussed in the lectures. Enrollment is limited to 50 seats for the workshop.
